

Beyond Values Clarification: Best Ethical Practices for Integrating the Spiritual Dimension in Assessment Practices Presenters: Mike Desposito, Katie Gamby

There are several benefits for infusing spirituality into standard assessment practices. This experiential presentation will define spiritual assessment in the context of clinical assessment practices, distinguish between various ethical codes and competencies to highlight sensitivity to spiritual oriented clients and cultures, and select competent and ethical assessment practices to address spiritual and religious identities in counseling.

## Spiritual Disengagement among Clients with Addiction: A Treatment Approach Presenter: Vicki Giegerich

The presenters will elucidate the complex relationship between spirituality and addiction before exploring the phenomena of spiritual disengagement in clients with addictions. Attachment theory and its relation to addiction, recovery, and spirituality will be explored. Attendees will be provided with spiritual assessment guidelines and interventions to specifically address spiritual disengagement with clients.



## When a Good Thing Goes Bad: Spiritual Bypass as a Roadblock to Growth

**Presenters: Katie Gamby, Mike Desposito, Morgan Stohlman** A phenomenon called, "spiritual bypass" referring to an "unhealthy misuse of the spiritual life to avoid dealing with psychological difficulties" can cause issues for counselors when assisting clients in therapy. In this session, attendees will learn how to identify spiritual bypass in their clients, learn about the Spiritual Bypass Questionnaire, and apply learning to a case study.
